Fr. Paul's retirement




After 15 years of dedicated service to Pulborough, Fr. Paul is retiring. His last Eucharist at school will be a special Harvest Eucharist at 9.00am on Thursday 29th September. We hope to see as many parents, grandparents and friends as possible. The children will be preparing a special farewell for Fr. Paul which will be shared with him at that service. His last Sunday services with a sermon will be at 8.00 am and 10.30 am on Sunday 25th September. There will be refreshments afterwards. You are most welcome to attend. On October 1 there will be

an afternoon tea in the Village Hall between 4.00pm and 6.00pm to say goodbyr to Fr. Paul and his family. His last Sunday will be 2nd October with services at both 8.00 am and 10.30 am when Sunday School will be in church along with some Uniformed Groups. Refreshments will be served after that service, too. Again, you are welcome to attend. Fr Paul has been a great supporter of St Mary's over the years and has been a very visible presence in the school, at school assemblies, in the support he gives to staff, his role as a Governor, the presence he has on the playground and the way he has helped families in his friendly and approachable way . He will be sorely missed by us as a school. We will be presenting him with gift vouchers at the Harvest Eucharist and if any parents would like to make a contribution to his leaving gift, donations can be left at the School Office. School Uniform

A very big thank you to everyone for following the school guidelines on tying children's hair back with discreet blue, black or white ribbons, bows, slides, etc. Please also make sure that your child has the correct PE kit – blue / black shorts, a white T-shirt and plimsolls. Leggings and football shirts will not be allowed. I would like to remind you that school shoes should be black – please do not send your child in wearing coloured trainers. When it begins to get cold and children need to wear



boots for walking to school, they will need to bring a pair of indoor shoes to change into. Children will not be allowed to wear their boots indoors.

Meeting with teachers



May I ask that if you wish to have a chat with your child's teacher, you do **not** go into the classroom first thing in the morning. It is a very busy time for the staff as they get their classrooms ready for the day. They are happy to make an appointment to see you after school, but please arrange this with them directly as Mrs Hancock doesn't have their timetables. There will be a 'Meet the Teacher' evening on Wednesday 21 September at 7.00pm. This is not a Parents Evening where you discuss your child's progress – those take place in the Spring and Summer terms.

We would also ask you not to bring your child to their classroom if they are in Year 2 or above. As a school we encourage independence in our pupils and coming into school on their own is a good start to this. Please wave them goodbye in the front playground and let them walk round to their classroom on their own. If your child finds it hard to leave you, please talk to Mrs Brown or their teacher for further advice and support.

Car Parking

Please do NOT park where children and parents will have to walk out into the road to get around your car. The
