**Little Explorer news** – Last Friday we had our sports day which was a great success the children had lots of fun taking part in running races, egg and spoon, sack race, balancing bean bags and the relay race. This week we have been looking at building and construction we have been using shaving foam as cement to build walls with the bricks, copying patterns with Duplo and using diggers and dump trucks.

This week's Boogie beats session had a fairy tale theme, the children heard a story and song about Cinderella, and they also had fun with the prince, princess and the horse on the parachute. At forest school on Wednesday the children enjoyed looking for bugs, den building, making pretend fires and making bubble wand.

William Orrell report: - On the 20th of June 2019 Year 5 went on a spectacular trip to the Sea Life Centre in Brighton, the day started by a relatively short coach journey. How do I know? I was on the trip! When we got to the Centre we were sorted in to groups, took a picture of us in our groups and set off at 11am. We had a workshop where we had to design a poster to save various ocean creatures. Next, after a bit more fish spotting it was lunch time. After lunch we went to the Rain Forest area. At about 2pm it was time to get on the coach to come home.

**Yr6 Mini Spanish lesson**: -Year 6 have spent the last few weeks planning and preparing to teach a mini Spanish lesson to KS1. #### Free football coaching with Chelsea FC -

Horsham District Year of Culture brings free football coaching with Chelsea FC coaches. Want to practice football with the professionals? How about a taster session at the new Horsham Football ground with Chelsea Football Club football coaches?

The free soccer skill sessions are open to all children under 15, with two sessions for under eights to under 11s and two sessions for under 12s to under 15s.

At the event, taking place on Saturday 29 June at Horsham Football Club at Hop Oast, Chelsea FC Foundation coaches will be joining the Horsham FC staff at the soccer skills day to provide a day of free coaching.

The event has been organised as part of Horsham District Council's Horsham District Year of Culture's 52 Project, with the aim to celebrate culture in all its forms across the District every weekend. The 60 minute session will use the whole of the new 3G pitch and divide it into five 'skill zones' teaching different skills in each one.

Chelsea FC will be bringing an inflatable football target as well as the Chelsea FC mascot Stamford the Lion, who will be selfie ready!

Horsham District Council Cabinet Member for Culture and Leisure Cllr Jonathan Chowen commented: "Culture surrounding sport is all- important, and to have Horsham FC and Chelsea FC working together to offer this incredible opportunity, for free, to local children is an inspiring way of involving young people in the Year of Culture, in an easily accessible fashion."

As the children will be on a 3G pitch it is important they wear the appropriate footwear. The new stadium will be open for refreshments and parents are very welcome to stay and enjoy the facilities. Spaces for this workshop are limited so book early to avoid disappointment.
