

Nick Nuttall is the former Environment Correspondent of the Times (1989 to 2000). From 2001 to 2018 he was first the Director of Communications and Spokesperson for the UN Environment Programme headquartered in Nairobi and then UN climate change (UNFCCC) in Bonn, Germany. He was also the Spokesperson for the landmark Paris Agreement. Today he is a presenter with We Don't Have Time with up to 10 million viewers in 150 countries.
