Kingfishers Club and link with St Mary's church - The school kingfishers group & St Mary's Church were raising money for the toilet twinning initiative... also part of the church eco-friendly award. Alongside the Kingfisher's Group we have



raised £263.75, which is amazing! By twinning the toilets, we will enable families to build a basic toilet, have access to clean water and learn about hygiene - a vital combination that saves lives. By twinning a tap we are able to give the gift of safe, clean water that is sustainable, reliable and affordable. The toilet twinning charity also works closely with communities to promote good hygiene including handwashing. This helps them protect themselves against the spread of infection – for any kind of communicable disease, not just in a pandemic. With your generosity and support we have funded the following life-saving installations - 1 Tap DRC Democratic Republic of Congo, 1 Tap in Afghanistan, Latrine in Bloc Hewa, Bora, Lwanma, DRC, Latrine in Poliedouo, 2 Bouna, Cote d'Ivoire, Africa.

Keeping children safe – We, as a school, are dealing with more issues around social media and accounts at home. There is a new app called 'Twitch'. Twitch is the world's most popular live streaming platform and has around 140 million active users. It is extremely popular in the gaming community. Please be aware that children at this school are using it and as it is live streamed no one can predict what is going to come up. Twitch is rated 13+, but there is no age-verification when you sign up. Please check if your child is using it. Most apps have a 13+ rating, please ensure you check your child's social media at least once a week and read messages.

Could It Be Dyslexia ...?

Common signs of dyslexia, include, but are not limited to...

Difficulty with Rhyming

Children with dyslexia often struggle to hear rhymes & identify rhyming words.

Effortful Writing

Dyslexic children frequently find writing to be painstaking and tiring.

Unpredictable Word Retrieval

It is common for children with dyslexia to struggle with being able rapidly retrieve words, much less put them in the correct order. This is very evident during oral reading and conversation.

Memorization Difficulties

Memorizing information presents a real challenge to dyslexic children. Having to recall the information later on is even more difficult.


Reluctance to Read

Children with dyslexia tend to alternate between having "good" and "bad" days when it comes to reading. Some days, things "click" and come together relatively well, while other days present a real struggle in getting all the pieces to "fit together."

Poor Spelling

Hearing the sounds that make up words, and placing those sounds in the correct order, is very challenging and inconsistent.


