

Vocabulary

Story map- a visual representation of the story including key words.

Hero- someone who is admired for their courage or achievements.

Mission- an important trip given to a person or group of people

Superhero - A superhero is a character in a cartoon or film who has special powers and fights against evil.

Rescue - If you rescue someone, you get them out of a dangerous or unpleasant situation.

Disguise - If you are in disguise, you are not wearing your usual clothes or you have altered your appearance in other ways, so that people will not recognise you.

Costume - An actor's or performer's costume is the set of clothes they wear while they are performing.

Fabric - Fabric is cloth or other material produced by weaving together cotton, nylon, wool, silk, or other threads. Fabrics are used for making things such as clothes, curtains, and sheets. Material - A solid substance.

Transform - To transform something into something else means to change or convert it into that thing.

Police - The police are the official organization that is responsible for making sure that people obey the law. They are also here to help people if they need it, e.g. if you get lost.

Invisibility - If you describe something as invisible, you mean that it cannot be seen, for example because it is transparent, hidden, or very small.

Paramedic - A paramedic is a person whose training is similar to that of a nurse and who helps doctors in medical work. They work in ambulances and sometimes in helicopters.

Emergency - An emergency is an unexpected and difficult or dangerous situation, especially an accident, which happens suddenly and which requires quick action to deal with it.
