Curriculum – We have had new books arrive this week to supplement our 'Reading Spine'. Key texts are the key to the children's engagement in reading, especially if the children then read the whole series of something!

Phonics – The staff have been updating their phonics training this week. It was great to ensure that we have consistent expectations right across the school and how we teach to get those sounds to stick in the children's long term memory making them better readers and writers.

Year 6 Football - On Friday, the Year 6 boy's football team travelled to Tanbridge House for the Horsham Sports Services schools tournament. After a heavy 5-0 defeat in their first game, against the eventual champions Heron Way, St Mary's went on to record two draws and a defeat in their remaining pool games with a last minute goal denying us victory against Kingslea. Harry H scored a well worked goal for St Mary's first of the afternoon. A 2-0 defeat to Leechpool in the qualifiers led to a final game against Southwater B, which St Mary's won comfortably with goals from Henry W and a goal of the season contender from Max D. Brilliant effort from the boys (Luke T, Billy B, William C, Alex B, Harry H, Henry W, Max D, Rylan B) who grew in confidence as the afternoon wore on. Very well led by the Captain Luke T and a special mention to Rylan B for keeping two clean sheets. Next week it the turn of the Year 6 girls.

Weald Book Award: Congratulations to the Year 6 children who have taken part in the Weald Book Award this year. This is a project for able readers involving other primary schools in the locality. The group involved have read six challenging books by new authors and participated in competitions where they have submitted work based on these titles. After reading all six books, the children were asked to vote for their favourite; our votes were then combined with those from other participating schools to determine the overall winner. Well done to Abi, Charlie, Amelie, Luke, William G and Caleb (South Africa) and Isla, William C, Robin, Molly, Keely and Noah (Japan) for their hard work and commitment to the project throughout the year. This week, we learnt that 'The Last Bear' by Hannah Gold was voted the winner of the Weald Book Award 2022. 'Darwin's Dragons' by Lindsay Galvin and 'The Ship of Shadows' by Maria Kuznar were voted joint second place. We were also delighted to hear that the following children from St Mary's were chosen as winners for their competition entries:



Reflection for this week – Four children from South Africa Class led worship this week, based on the theme of compassion. Luke, Jonah, Amelie and Martina had worked with Mrs Smith from St Mary's Church earlier in the week to plan this act of worship. They began by asking the rest of the class to define compassion and explain what it meant to them. The children talked about compassion being 'love in action' and linked this to current world events. Amelie read the story of 'The Healed Leper' (Luke 17:11-16) and other members of the class were invited to join in with acting out the story. Finally, the children shared a memory verse from 1 John 3:17, followed by a song and a prayer. Our learning – Ireland class Yr 3 shadow hunting – As part of Year 3 Science week we have been learning about light and shadows. The children went on a shadow hunt around the school. Their objective was to identify the source of the light and how the shadow is formed. Key vocabulary included Opaque, Natural or man-made source.

Year 4 have been making volcanoes using biscuits and cream – they talked about the 'Magma' and the 'Tectonic Plates' and how Mountains are formed and Earth quakes occur. This is great hands-on, practical learning that helps the children to understand the vocabulary and the concepts.
