Year 4 RSPB trip - Living Things and their Habitats & Pond Habitat Study



The Year 4 children had an exciting visit to Pulborough Brooks RSPB on Tuesday 14th June looking at habitats including food chains and a pond study and the dangers to habitats such as building houses, roads, pollution, etc. They used data loggers to find the temperature in the water in shade and in full sun; they measured the light levels in lux.



The children looked at classification keys to independently to work out what type of Minibeasts they had caught in their nets. The children found a great variety of creatures including a Great Crested Newt, snails, water boatmen, water fleas, water shrimp, a caddisfly larva, etc. The first session finished with a game showing what happens when ponds and flood meadows are lost due to modern living, which results in creatures, such as the Great Crested Newt, losing their habitat.
