Questionnaire for Remote Learning – We are keen to know how things are going for parents so please could you complete the questionnaire that has been emailed out. We are keen to help families as much as we can. You may be experiencing issues or things might be going well, so please tell, us as we can only learn and move things forward with feedback from you.

Google Classroom – This is proving to be a brilliant platform for us as a school and we are pleased with how quickly we got everything up and running for the children in this lockdown. We feel that all the learning is in one place for parents and it hasn't crashed meaning that access is available at all times. The teachers are planning 3 hours of learning for EYFS/KS1 and 4 hours of learning for KS2. The site is well organised so you can find what you have on a day-by-day basis. It is easy to submit learning back to the teachers. We have been able to have a teacher answering your year group emails daily meaning that things are picked up quickly. The class are getting a weekly Google Meet to liaise with their class and the teacher face to face. The teacher can give feedback and help with questions and queries. On top of all that, the teachers are having training each week so we are learning to do more and more which will be of benefit to the children. We have achieved so much in our first week. If you have any suggestions then please let me know via the Google questionnaire. We are looking at other things moving forward so watch this space!

Teachers and saying 'thank you' – We have the most dedicated team of teachers at school and they are doing their very best with the demands of remote learning and face to face teaching. Some of the staff are self-isolating and some have their own children to teach. We are human and are trying our best.

Please be aware of this when you are communicating with teachers and please be kind and considerate always. We know that this lockdown has made parents anxious and that it is not easy but I will not tolerate abuse towards the staff.

Key workers – The Government guidance is very clear. Even if you are a key worker, if you are working from home then your child should stay at home. The education unions are now pushing for your child to only attend if both parents are key workers and are leaving the house so the guidance may change again shortly and then we will contact families directly again and ask that you reapply for the school place. We have to keep the children and staff safe at his time.

Children out in the village – It has been brought to our attention that children maybe out in the village unattended. All children must be at home with parental supervision during this lockdown. A few weeks ago, there were some warnings about children being approached by adults in and around the Pulborough are. Please ensure you do not let the children go out unaccompanied and that they are kept safe at all times.

Children with Special Educational Needs – If your child normally has an Individual Learning Plan (ILP) then you may need some more support from us. Miss Wilkins can be contacted on mwilkins@stmarysprimarypulborough.co.uk and she can help with accessibility features on Microsoft Word and Google Classroom. She also has help guides on sound to text support and voice recordings. Miss Wilkins and her team can send out visual timetables if the day is becoming overwhelming or coloured rulers to help with print, coloured paper to help with the glare, spelling lists or key word cards. Please see the letter that was emailed out earlier in the week.

Compass Card – Compass Card scheme is for children and young people with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities living or going to school in West Sussex.

About the Compass

- The Compass scheme is run in West Sussex and Brighton and Hove by the charity Amaze. It includes the
 West Sussex Disability Register (a statutory duty for WSCC) and a free leisure discount card for all children
 and young people on the Register.
- The Disability Register is for 0 to 25 year olds who have an EHCP (Education Health Care Plan) in school/college or are eligible for DLA/PIP. Other children and young people, who have a disability that has a major effect on their daily living, may also be eligible. Data from the Register is used to inform and shape SEND services.
- When families register (for free) on the Compass scheme they receive a discount card giving access to leisure
 activities for local disabled children and young people (at 300+ venues in non-Covid times). It Gets Me Out,
 an independent evaluation of the West Sussex Compass Project by the University of Brighton in May 2020,
 demonstrates that the Compass Card significantly improves children and young people's physical fitness,
 mental health, and confidence.


China Class Art work – China class produced some lovely art work as part of their space topic and we have put it up at the front of the school but thought we would share it as it looks amazing. Well done to China class.






Access to Google Classroom -
