Happy New Year – We would like to wish you all a very Happy New Year from all the staff and Governors and hope that you had a wonderful Christmas. As you will be aware COVID cases are very high at the moment in this area, although we have very few cases currently in school. We are thankful that we have been able to open with enough staff, however, please be aware that this term might be a challenge with staff and we may need to change staff or worst case scenario, close classes. We will communicate with parents if we need to make changes.

Temperatures for learning – As winter is here, temperatures have dropped and the classrooms have got cooler. We do still have to follow Government guidance and ventilate the classrooms with open windows due to COVID, but we will ensure that the classrooms are at least 16 degrees Celsius (minimum). The children may want to wear a vest, or another layers, underneath their uniform. We now have carbon dioxide monitors in all the classrooms so we are able to ventilate based on the readings from these to ensure we are following guidelines and keep the children safe.

Update to guidance — you may be aware of the new guidance this week concerning PCR testing after a positive LFT. Just to confirm if your child has a positive LFT **but NO symptoms** they should still isolate and take LTF on day 6 & day 7, if these are both negative they can return to school on day 8. No PCR test is required.

However, if your child has **a positive LFT and symptoms** they must get a PCR and isolate as per current Government Guidance.

*In both these scenarios please let the school office know of any LFT or PCR test results.

Welcome – **Mrs Hatcher** has taken up the post of Deputy Headteacher. She will be out on the gate in the mornings to meet the parents and welcome the children in, and will be teaching India class in the afternoon.

We are also welcoming **Mr Barrett-Garlick** as a teaching assistant on a six month placement and he will work in different classes across the school.

School Improvement priorities for Spring Term – We are going to be Focussing on Oracy and spoken language within the curriculum this term, this will include; Stamina for reading with high quality texts; extended writing in all subject areas; Mental maths skills with basic times tables being implemented from Y1.

We will also be looking at how we embed learning in the children's long-term memory, with retrieval of learning and how we teach our lessons to help the children with this.

Homework – Homework grids are up on your child's Google classroom. If you need a paper copy then please email the teacher on the class email.

INSET DAY – This is on the **Monday 28th February** and is based on staff professional development. As a teaching staff, we will be focussing on Oracy and spoken language through drama and linking this in to our curriculum across all subject areas.

Themes for the term – The themes are off and running this term with UK and Austria

thinking about 'Love of the Outdoors', Key Stage One focussing on 'Memory box and the past', Year 3 looking at 'Predators and Prey', Year 4 being Historians and focussing on 'Temples, Tombs and Treasure'. Year 5 are looking at the "Greeks" and Year 6 are looking at "Explorers and Adventurers". There is such a lot of learning here and it builds on previous topics that the children have done so they can link their learning and build on skills and knowledge.

Christian Values – Humility, Service and Forgiveness – We will be looking at these values this half term and talking to the children about opportunities to show these.

Church links – All of the classes will be visiting St Mary's church this term for an assembly on a Friday. We are so thankful for Fr Paul and his team of volunteers who help staff these events.

Year 5 Greek Day – The children loved dressing up in their Greek clothes and immersing themselves in this topic with Greek food and having a go at the Greek Olympics whilst learning about the events.
