The children found out about reuse, recycle, reduce and how we can protect our world and then they attended a workshop about life cycles in the wild and food chains. PIRA and PUMA information – There have been a few enquiries and wanted to explain a few things about the tests that we are using to monitor progress.

PIRA means Progress in Reading Assessment and PUMA means Progress in Understanding Maths Assessment

The Standard Age Score (SAS) is based on the student's raw score which has been adjusted for age and placed on a scale. This makes a comparison with a nationally representative sample of students of the same age across the UK and in British-curriculum international schools. The average score is 100.

If the child has a score below 80 in any of the assessments we would be concerned and be looking for a monitoring form (Class based) or an individual learning plan (through discussion with Miss Wilkins (SENDCo)).

Please remember that this is completed in a test situation and sometimes children find tests very tricky – a test is a skill on its own. Results can fluctuate as tests are done on one day and it is one moment in time. If you have any other questions then please do not hesitate to ask us.

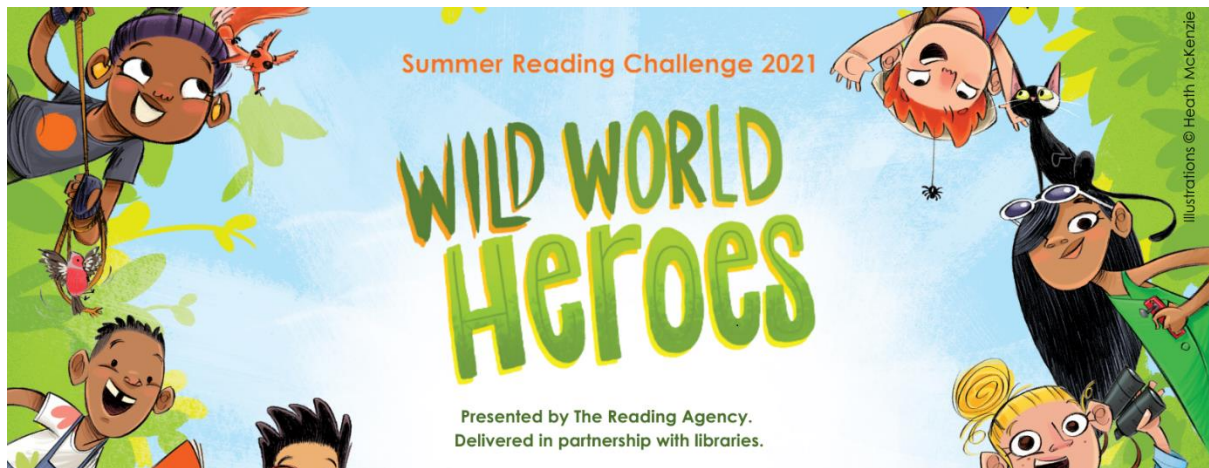
Reading books – If you have any school reading books at home – please could I ask that you return them to school by the last week of term. We have lost many books and we need everyone to look to see if they have any please.
