We all had a fantastic time and learnt a lot.

**RSPB** came to work with Key Stage One – It was lovely to see the RSPB in school working with KS1, they made the children into scientists and they investigated the four seasons, outside they found lots of signs of Winter as well as Autumn had been and Spring was on its way.

**Leadership for Year 5** – Barry Meany (Sports Lead at The Weald) has been putting the Year 5 teachers through their paces with some leadership skills. This is to be able to buddy up with the younger children and provide play opportunities at playtimes. This will help a great opportunity for the children but also helps with purposeful playtimes.
