PE – some of the girls are asking about bringing in roll on deodorant. Most roll on deodorants are 24 hours so this isn't necessary and the weather is getting cooler.

Yellow photos – This year we are having a new company to take our school photos 'Yellow'. Due to current circumstances, they will not be taking sibling group pictures only individual photos with NO exceptions. We realise that it is disappointing that sibling group ones will not be done but they are pleased to be able to offer individual ones in line with Yellow's policies and procedures.

Yellow will be offering a Family sibling 25% discount to support parents wishing to purchase the 2020 individual photographs of their siblings. "Family discount" will provide a 25% reduction on their individual photographs purchased

For example, a sibling family purchasing of 2 individuals of Pack 7 (10x8) at £12 each would cost £24, but after applying Family 25% discount on total purchase new lower price will be £18. This reduction will automatically be applied at Checkout for online orders, or parents returning orders to our Drop Box in the school, are to place the individual photo Proofcards into the **one order bag** and reduce total price by 25% with cheque/cash payment

Meet The Teacher – A Zoom invite will come out to you on Friday this week for our 'Meet the teacher'.

The rest of the school will be Wednesday 23rd September at 4pm.

This is just for parents, not for the children. It is an opportunity for parents to meet the teacher, find out more about procedures in the classroom and ask questions. Whilst they are presenting, if you have question then put them in the chat bar and at the end the teacher will answer individual questions. The questions shouldn't be about individual children, those questions can be sent via an email to the class email address. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Special educational needs and disability (SEND) – If your child receives interventions in school then details about these will start coming out to you as parents with a copy of your child's individual learning plan (ILP). Please be aware that we can only run certain interventions due to COVID 19 restrictions. 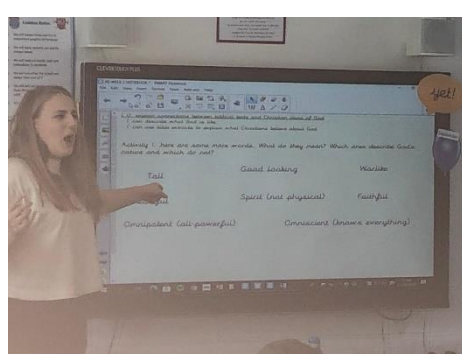
Please be aware for the safety of the whole school community, we are running a 'zero tolerance' if children cough in each other's faces or endanger the safety of others in a purposeful way.

Making Sense of It All Foundation Course **NEW**

Wednesday 30th September, 7th & 14th October 10.30am

This new three-part course has been designed to provide an introduction to all the key issues and challenges common to parents and carers. It aims to empower parents of children who are undergoing or have recently undergone diagnosis but it will be helpful to any parents who would like to learn more about how SEND processes work.
