Hot School Meals - Order the meal your child would like.

Chartwells are bringing in a new system that allows you to choose which meal your child would like to eat each day.

This is for all children throughout the school, from Reception through to Year 6, those entitled to free school meals and those who pay for a meal.

You will be receiving a letter from ParentPay with all your log-in details and details of how the system will work. The system opens on the 11th November for you to start ordering and the first meals ordered on this new system will be served on the 5th December. Please be aware that meals for the 5th December will need to be ordered by midnight on the 24th November.

The School Office will have very limited access to the system, so it is very important that if you wish your child to have a hot school meal in school, no matter which class they are in, you have to access this system and order their meal.

Hockey report - Written by Amara A and Will K -


"In the Hockey Festival we had 7 activity stations which helped improve our hockey skills.


Free First Aid Courses run by Training Legs First Aid in conjunction with the Chanctonbury Leisure Centre & the Pulborough Wardens
