Football – Friday saw the beginning of the Horsham Sports Services 7-a-side football tournaments at Tanbridge House. After a difficult campaign in the league back in the Autumn term, the Year 6 boys were determined to do better this time round. An entertaining opening 0-0 draw against Castlewood had to be decided by a footgolf challenge. Nicolo A confidently stepped up and duly delivered the boys' first victory of the afternoon. Next up was eventual runners-up Heron Way. The boys battled hard against a very strong opponent and were only narrowly defeated 2-1, a real sign of the progress they have made as a team. This resulted in the boys advancing to the second tier where their first opponents were St Mary's Horsham. A dominant and exciting display of attacking football saw the boys win 4-0 with two goals from Freddie G and one apiece for Kian W and Tyler C. Tiredness crept in for the final game against a very strong Southwater side who emerged victorious with a 3-0 win.

The boys finished the tournament in 6th place overall out of 14 teams, which is the highest placed finish for a St Mary's team at Tanbridge House. Very well done to all of the squad - Kian W (c), William K, Freddie G, Nicolo A, Rocco W, Tyler C, Levi E and Reg H.

Fairtrade Fortnight – We launched Fairtrade Fortnight with a whole school worship on Monday. The Fairtrade Prefects, **Freya, Darcey, Tyler and Daria,** introduced this year's theme, which is all about the future of food. They began with a quiz in which the rest of the school were asked to guess which Fairtrade products were being described, based on a series of clues. The prefects then explained the impact that extreme weather conditions and natural disasters, such as flooding, landslides and drought, can have on farmers.

New Zealand Class performed brilliantly in a drama titled 'Thank You for the Chocolate!' This showed the children just how many people are involved in getting the food that they eat to their kitchen table! The cocoa farmer, ship's captain, factory worker, packer, lorry driver and shopkeeper all have vital roles to play in the journey. Finally, children from South Africa Class performed 'The Fairtrade Step,' ending with the question 'What will your step be?' We encouraged everyone to think about the steps they can take to ensure that the farmers receive a fair price for their hard work.


