**Parents Evening** – Thank you for attending parent's evenings. We are aware that on the report the last set of PIRA and PUMA data was autumn 2022. The teachers now have the spring '23 data so do email them if you would like this information. The teachers may not come back with an answer until after the holidays now though. Our next parent evenings will be in July.

**Medical Tracker** – Medical tracker is a new reporting system which allows staff to log medication and minor injuries. If you have consented to your child having Calpol / antihistamine, we can give the age related dose to your child if we feel this is necessary between 12noon & 2pm and you will receive an email advising you that this has been administered. We will also use this to advise you if your child has been treated for a minor injury but has gone back to class happily.

**Staffing** – We have welcomed back **Mrs Huntley-Hart** this week and we want to thank **Mrs Callender** for working with UK class over the last few months. Mrs Callender will be staying with us in the summer term and will be teaching swimming in KS2.
