Early Years – Our Early Years children have settled already and we have seen them exploring the environment. They saw how pumpkins grew and picked some and then looked at the inside. They counted the seeds, made a vocabulary bank of words and did observational drawings of pumpkins. The children also collected the sunflowers that we grew.







Display – The whole school has started thinking about our Christian value this term, which is LOVE. The children thought about people they love, how we show love and how others may show love to them. In our prayer corners the children have been thinking about who they would like to pray for and many of the children have mentioned Queen Elizabeth II in their prayers. Our front board shows the contributions from all the children as we spread the LOVE!



Learning - What a fantastic first week with so much new learning going on – UK and Thailand are learning about 'The world around them'. Italy and India are learning about 'Superheroes'. Year 3 have started the 'Stone Age' theme with a super starter of a Stone Age Day, Year 4 are learning about 'Rumble in the Jungle', SA, Japan and Mexico are learning about 'World War 2' and have launched their learning with an Evacuee Day. Collaborative learning is very important; this was a bridge building activity that encouraged the children to work together and use custard creams – Mrs Copus' favourite biscuit!



Maths – In South Africa and Japan class, the children have been generating larger numbers using dice, this was a way of showing their understanding and developing their independence for learning and the children in Italy class were using manipulatives to find out about numbers. Active learning is the best way to create memorable learning experiences.

Maths investigation – We have seen some great maths going on through investigations this week, Ireland have been thinking about numbers and the number system





Reading – We have excellent reading buddies who are making recommendations for reading books - look at South Africa's recommendations and the reviews of books that they have read.

Potato Farls - Learning about Ireland - Ireland class made their own potato farls as they found out more about Ireland. This is active, engaging and memorable learning for the children.

Knowledge organisers – On the class pages are knowledge organisers to help parents and show what the children should know by the end of this half-termly topic. Please do spend some time talking about the learning for this half term.

Class Dojo - you will receive details from your class teacher about logging on to Class Dojo so that you can see what rewards your child is receiving.

Safequarding newsletter – This went out last week and is a new initiative to keep parents informed of how we safeguard your children in school. It has many interesting topics to give you more information about safeguarding children. Our Designated Safeguard Leads are Mrs Copus, Mrs Hatcher, Miss Wilkins and **Miss Turner.**

Anti bullying – As a school we do sometimes have cases of bullying reported, as children learn to play together, and we take these very seriously. As soon as we know that something is happening we will meet with the children concerned first, then we will see if the bullying stops, we will involve parents if needed and we will continue to meet with the children to ensure it dealt with fully. If you are concerned that your child is being bullied, please contact the school straight away.
