School Improvement – Following our recent OFSTED inspection, we know that we are focussing on further development of the curriculum with a particular focus on Design and Technology, Physical Education across the school and Art. We have already talked about high expectations for all and pushing children to get better and better in their learning. We are also focussing on standards in writing across all curriculum areas and encouraging children to think about extended writing for different purposes and for different audiences.

Reading – Reading is so important for a child's development. It helps them develop a knowledge of the world around them, deduce and infer information, learn new vocabulary, ask questions, identify key words and phonetic patterns and helps them to learn about personal, social and emotional aspects of the world. Your child should come home with a book each week for you to sit with them and share. You can also use the library to develop a love of books.



The Billingshurst Lions want you to design a poster promoting peace in the world.

The theme is 'What is Peace'.

The best poster in each class will win a £10 token to be spent in WH Smith, plus a certificate. The runner-up in each class will get a certificate, too.

This contest is open to children aged 8, 9 and 10 by 31st August 2023, and gives an opportunity for a discussion on the true importance of peace.

The best poster from each class will also be sent to the South East Headquarters of the Lions Clubs, where it will be entered for another competition. The prizes will be:

1st - a £30 art voucher + £100 for the School

2nd - a £25 art voucher + £50 for the School

3rd - a £20 art voucher + £50 for the School

What you need to do:

Design a poster promoting peace in the world

Do it on paper or card no larger than A3 and no smaller than A4

Make sure you put your name, class, year group and school on the back of the poster - which must not be folded

When you need to do it by:

Your poster must be handed in at School by Thursday the 16th of March 2023.

Peace Art Competition 2023

Your child is participating in the Lions Poster for Peace contest.

The Billingshurst & District Lions Club is sponsoring the contest at the 10 local Primary Schools in the Billingshurst area and, by entering this competition, your child will be joining many others in their vision of world peace. This contest is open to children aged 8, 9 and 10 by 31st August 2023, and gives an opportunity for a discussion on the true importance of peace.

Prizes

The best poster in each class will receive a winner's certificate and prize - and will be submitted to the UK Lions South East regional competition, too. The runner-up in each class will receive a certificate of commendation.

The South East District Prize Winner will receive an award to keep and tokens to the value of £30 for Art products. Their school will receive an Award to keep for the year and a cheque for £100. The District runner-up will receive £25 of tokens and their school a cheque for £50. The District 3rd prize winner will receive £20 of tokens and their school a cheque for £50.

Rules

The theme is 'What is Peace'. Art work must be no larger than A3 and no smaller than A4. The name, class, year group and school of the child must be written on the back of the poster.

Artwork should be done on flexible material, so that it can be rolled for posting: Don't fold it! Do not laminate artwork; however, fixative spray may be used.

Artwork must be original and the effort of just one child. Children entering the competition must be aged 8 to 10 years old on 31 August 2023 (ie currently in Years 3, 4 & 5).

The deadline for entries is Thursday the 16th of March 2023: The Lions will collect all entries from the School on 16th or 17th of March.

Lions Clubs International is the world's largest service club organisation, with more than 1.4 million members in 205 countries. The Lions have a strong commitment to community service and helping youth throughout the world. The Billingshurst Lions raise money via their bookshop in Jengers Mead and the Christmas carols collection each December. Since its founding in 1973, the Billingshurst Lions have raised and donated well in excess of £750,000, most of which was donated to local causes.
