Egyptian Day – As part of their topic on Ancient Egypt, Sierra Leone and USA classes welcomed two representatives from Horsham Museum with a selection of Egyptian artefacts. The children have already been learning about life and death in Ancient Egypt, including the processes of mummification, Egyptian gods and the building of pyramids. The children were able to discuss the different social levels of Egyptian society, their clothing and jewellery and what they ate. They also tried their hands at writing their names using hieroglyphs. The school was full of Egyptian maidens, gods and more Pharaohs than you could shake a 'heka' (Pharaoh's staff) at!



Reading Millionaires – Well done to Martha B (SA) who has read over 2 million words so far this year and Rowan S (SA), they have both been given their Literacy Awards for reaching one million words read. Accelerated Reader – As part of our drive to encourage children to move forward with their reading, we have inaugurated a Key Stage 2 Accelerated Reader raffle. When the children finish a book in their reading range, they can take an Accelerated Reader quiz. If they score 100% in the quiz, their name will be written on a raffle ticket and then entered in to a half termly draw to win a prize. We will let you know before February half term who our first winners are. Please be aware that the children

can log on to Accelerated Reader at home to access these quizzes at weekends and during the holidays, not just during school time.

Greek vases – Greek Art: South Africa class have been learning about Ancient Greek black-figure pottery, which was first produced in Corinth around 700BC and dominated the Mediterranean pottery market for the next 200 years. The Ancient Greek pots and vases represent Greek mythology, religious, social and sporting practices. The size, shape and decorations developed over time. Early decorations used simple lines and grooves; as time went on, the designs included more intricate zigzag patterns and geometric shapes.



What we have been doing

It's been all systems go to get the pantry open after deciding to go for it in November. A huge community effort has made it possible. Pulborough Parish Council allowed us to use their meeting room to create this space to reduce food waste from local supermarkets led by Lidl, Sainsbury's and UK Harvest. We also have a drop in area welcoming people to keep warm, have a cuppa and enjoy a chat.

The Opening

We opened officially on 6th January 2024 and have already seen 400+ people visiting who have helped us save nearly 400kg of food from going to landfill.

We invite everyone to help us stop this food going to waste. Donations have also helped us supply some goods, non-perishable sanitary items, toiletries and baby products for those who need it. We are talking to Horsham Matters about potential ongoing support for this and will let you know the outcome.





How you can help...

We get lots of bread, cakes, cheese and freezer food as well as other treats from our supermarkets that we invite everyone to enjoy for free. But if you want to make donations to help top up our supply of nonperishables especially we welcome donations via our GoFundMe page and The Greenhouse and The Pulborough Exchange have collection points for food.
