









**Six week in project** – Thank you to the parents that came to the six week in meeting. The morning was informative with a presentation from the library service and information from the school nurse and information about the Early Years curriculum and how the settling in has gone. There were positive comments that came from the meeting about forest schools, transition arrangements, communication with the teachers, settling process and some things that parents would like to see more of, which was around phonics and classes. We will ensure that we get information out to Early Years parents about these things over the next few weeks.

Learning – SA, Japan and Mexico have been writing their diaries as a soldier this week following their unit of work and the talk story. Look at the examples of some of the writing with their pupil assessments. Following on from their class-reading book, 'Letters from the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll, Japan and SA classes have been writing their own 'war diary entries'. The children were tasked with using as many of the features of diary entries as they could, including similes and metaphors, modal verbs and 'show, not tell' to enhance their writing. The results show how much they have learnt. Well done, Years 5 and 6!

Michael works for Life Charity and they run projects to help families in different African countries. The children asked some very thoughtful questions and we found out more about their work.
