**Learning - Year 3 Trip to Rio, Brazil** – Ireland and New Zealand class flew to Rio and took a tour of the city for the launch of our new topic 'Urban Pioneers'. It was great to see them with their own airline ticket and they went through the procedure of check in and boarding – a great experience for all. **Curriculum** – **UK and Thailand class** have begun focussing on Space, **Italy and India** are learning about Our Wonderful World, **New Zealand and Ireland** have started thinking about Urban Pioneers, **USA and Sierra Leone** are learning about Misty Mountain, Winding River and **Mexico, South Africa and Japan classes** are Exploring Africa and have an African drumming workshop next week to help launch their theme. 
