



Tea and Chat for writing – Ever wondered how you inspire your child to write? Ever wondered what teachers look for when we mark writing? Ever wondered how you can support at home? Mrs Hatcher is running a tea and chat gathering and the focus will be on writing. **This will be at 9.30am – 10.30am on Wednesday 22nd March**. You don’t have to join in just listen and share a hot drink and a biscuit with us.

Swimming pool timetable – The swimming pool will be open from **Monday 17th April for the children in KS2**. It is a heated pool and we will ensure it is warm enough for the children to swim. **All swimming kits should be in a draw string bag please, including hats** (for shoulder length or longer hair), **swimming costume** (no bikinis) **and a towel**. **Please ensure this is bought in on the morning their class is swimming to ensure they are ready for their time slot as times can vary on the day.**



SEND - Anxiety – we are seeing cases of anxiety in school. Anxiety is normal (as long as proportional) but can feel scary and we work with children to teach them to regulate themselves and to control the feeling of anxiety. Anxiety can breed anxiety so remaining calm and reassuring is paramount. There are some brilliant books that explain what anxiety is to children. If a child was struggling with Maths, we would spend time with them to explain and find solutions. Teaching children to breathe, calm and use physical exercise to control the feeling (as this distracts the brain and resets it - one way!) is the best strategy. There are ways to help children and parents can work on this with their child to normalise it. If you feel there is more to the anxiety then the way forward is to discuss this with a doctor.




Science Week competition – Science week began on the 13th March and Mrs Farrant is running a photography competition. Science Week – Thank you to Mrs Farrant for organising Science Week. We were thrilled to have a Cybersecurity visitor and a STEM scientist who worked with the children to enrich their knowledge of Science. There has been other Science experiments going on in classrooms such as Newton's first law of motion (inertia), chromatography, candles, blubber gloves, circuits, insulators to name a few. Do talk to your child about the Science they have been doing.

Year 4 wrote, 'We had 3 different sized jars and we lit a candle and covered it with a glass jar. We counted how many seconds it took for the candle to go out in the different sized jars. We discussed that fire needed fuel (waxed wick in this case), oxygen and a source of ignition (match). Most children predicted that the candle in the large jar would take the longest to go out and some thought the middle jar and some children thought the small jar. The candle under the largest glass jar took the longest time to go out because there was more oxygen in the large jar.'



Swimming Gala - Well done to Freddie, William, Anna, Martha, Scarlett, Ruben, Harry and Olivia. The team swam so well and we were awarded two second place and two third place medals. The enthusiasm the team showed was just amazing and they swam as winners!



Football - Another Friday, another football tournament at Tanbridge House and this time it was the long awaited turn of the Year 5 boys. They got off to a perfect start with a 2-0 win over Southwater B with goals coming from **Leo D and Franco F**. That led to a decider against a strong Leechpool A team who just edged a 1-0 victory. The boys were placed in Tier 2 for the knockout stages and quickly put the disappointment of the previous game behind them by beating Shelley 3-1. A penalty from **Leo D** and one goal apiece from **Andre D and Joseph S** set up a decider for the top spot in Tier 2 against Arunside. 
