Welcome back! I hope everyone has had a wonderful summer holiday and you are looking forward to the new term. It has been lovely to welcome the children into South Africa Class this week. Here is a brief outline of the topics we will be covering this term and some helpful points to note.

Themes for the term - 'Into the Unknown' and 'Peasants, Princes and Pestilence.'

During the first half of term, we will be venturing into the universe and exploring the elements of our Solar System. After half term, we travel back in time to the dark and deadly world of 14^{th} century Britain where the children will develop their knowledge of this period. We will learn about life in medieval times and will be studying the effects and impact of the Black Death.

Mental Maths, Arithmetic and problem solving activities will all be timetabled regularly.

Science: During the first half of term, we will be learning about 'The Earth and Space.' After half term, our Science topic will be 'Forces.'

Relationship and Health Education:

Relationships and Health Education is now statutory. For our Autumn term units, the Year 5 and Year 6 children will be taught separately. Year 5 will cover 'Growing Up and Changing' which introduces the physical changes that occur during puberty, personal hygiene, emotions and changes in behaviour. Year 6 will cover Sex and Relationship Education: 'Healthy Relationships & How a Baby is Made.'

<u>Please note:</u> An information meeting for Year 6 parents has been arranged for Thursday 5th October at 3:30pm to introduce what will be covered in this unit before the teaching and learning begins.

Computing: This term the children will develop their skills in the following areas:

- Databases
- Game Creator

History: We will be studying the book 'Hidden Figures' and discovering facts about famous people during Black History Month.

RE: We will begin the term by revisiting 'The Big Story of the Bible,' and developing our understanding of the key concepts in Christianity. We will then explore the topic of 'Incarnation.' After half term, we are fortunate to be welcoming the 'Bible Explorers' group, who will lead a sequence of lessons developing the children's understanding of a wide range of Bible stories through drama.

Art: The children will produce an abstract space painting inspired by the work of artist Peter Thorpe, using a variety of materials and techniques.

Music: We will be finding out about the life and work of the composer Gustav Holst and exploring his famous orchestral suite 'The Planets.' The children will explore how mood and atmosphere can be portrayed through the rhythms used by Holst to represent each of the planets and will describe their personal responses to the piece.

D&T: We will be developing our woodwork skills and making artefacts from medieval times.

Spanish: Our Autumn term topics are Body Parts, Transport and Christmas. These will be taught by Miss Bell.

Swimming: Year 5 and 6 Swimming will take place on Wednesdays and Thursdays (one session per week) on a three weekly rotation. Wednesday sessions will be taught by Mrs Callender (Weeks B and C) and Thursday sessions will be taught by myself (Week A). Please note that earrings must be removed for swimming lessons and children with long hair will require a swimming hat. Other useful items include deodorant (no sprays please) and a hairbrush. Verruca socks must be worn if required; these can be purchased from the local chemist or pharmacy. Please make sure that sun cream or hair gel are not applied before swimming. It would also be helpful if the children could have sun hats and raincoats to be worn at the poolside if needed.

PE: The children will need their PE kits to be brought into school each week. Outdoor PE lessons will be taught by Mrs Callender on Thursdays, who will be delivering Hockey and Netball.

Please ensure that children's PE kits are brought in on a Monday morning. They will remain in school all week and will then come home to be washed on a Friday. All kit must be clearly named, long hair must be tied back and earrings must be removed for PE sessions. Children should have PE shirts, shorts, outdoor shoes, long trousers and jumper or tracksuit for outdoors in their PE kits.

Gymnastics lessons will be taught in the second half of term when the swimming pool closes for winter.

Homework:

- Reading logs: Please ensure your child reads to you or independently weekly and this is signed and dated. This will form an important part of my assessment for reading and is a key dialogue between home and school. My expectation is a minimum of three entries per week. Reading logs will be checked daily. Please ensure that they are brought into school so that home reading can be rewarded and school based reading activities can be recorded. All children will be able to borrow books from the school library and our class reading corner. With reading at the heart of our school, we will be encouraging the children to record their comments and personal reflections on their reading material in their log books.
- Accelerated Reader/MyOn: We will complete the Star Reading Test each half term. This will provide us
 with a reading age for each child and which will indicate an appropriate colour band of books at the correct
 level. All fiction books borrowed from the school library contain a bar code and this should be used to
 access a quiz once a book has been completed to assess the children's reading comprehension. Accelerated
 Reader quizzes can be taken at home or at school.
- Weekly spellings: These will be set each Monday and tested on the following Monday. Word lists will be
 uploaded to Google Classroom each week and spelling books will remain in school. Please use the Bloom's
 Taxonomy spelling grid which provides suggestions on how to learn spellings in a multisensory way.
- Homework: Homework grids will be uploaded to Google Classroom half termly and will be linked to the theme we are learning about in school. All homework should be submitted electronically via Google Classroom. The children can either complete work on paper and upload a photograph or submit an electronic document. I will look at homework each week and feedback will be provided. There may also be opportunities for the children to show their homework in class to share the learning which has been taking place at home and celebrate outstanding work.
- TT Rockstars: We will be continuing to use TT Rockstars to support our Times Tables learning. If the children can confidently recall their tables, this has a significant impact on their fluency, speed of recall and accuracy when using written methods for multiplication and division. Please do encourage your children to practise their times tables at home regularly daily practice of even five minutes will quickly show improvements.
