

Despite missing their influential captain, the girls performed with the same positivity and determination that has characterised their performances over the past month. After losing their opening game 3-1 to the eventual champions Southwater Primary, St Mary's bounced back to beat Castlewood 2-0 with both goals courtesy of **Brooke G**, who ended with 12 goals in total over the 3 rounds of matches. The girls finished 5th in the league out of a total of 8 teams, which is a remarkable achievement given that so many in the squad had never played football before. We look forward to returning to Tanbridge House in March when there will be tournaments for all year groups in KS2 and another opportunity for the year 6 Girls too.
